CDHM Mission & Vision

Mission of the College of Dental Hygienists of Manitoba is regulating dental hygiene practice, ensuring competent and ethical provision of care for all Manitobans.

Vision of the College of Dental Hygienists of Manitoba is to contribute to the growth of the dental hygiene profession in Manitoba by advancing the profession, including increased access to dental hygiene care.

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Study Club and Journal Club Update

Many of our hygienists are members of a Journal or Study Club and have found it rewarding to share, learn and network with colleagues. In response to the popularity of these learning formats we have developed a guide and forms to register clubs with the College for annual registration and renewal of members and topics. This will provide structure and direction for efficient management of your club. Here are a few tips if you are thinking this might be a good format for your CCP learning:

- Think of a 'Journal Club' as a professional book club. Instead of books, members use professional journals/articles as evidence to facilitate group discussion and learning.
- A 'Study Club' can use a variety of learning resources such as webinars, professional speakers or a case-study review. Note that a lunch-and-learn or discussion among colleagues is not necessarily considered 'evidence' but can be a catalyst for future goal and objective setting.
- Each club will appoint a leader or contact person to register Study or Journal Clubs by September 30th for the upcoming year using the online forms, including your proposed topics and names of all members.
- Log meeting dates, times, topics and learning resources along with meeting attendees for ease of documentation when completing your individual CCR.
- Find a Study Club and Journal Club Guideline document at **www.cdhm.info** under the Continuing Competency menu to assist with organizing and coordinating your clubs.

It is time to register your Journal Club or Study Club for the upcoming CCP year. Please email your forms to VOlivier@cdhm.info with your new topics for the year. If your membership has not changed just let us know. If you have new members please send us a new list. Your forms are due by **September 30th, 2019**. Forms are available on the CDHM website.





You've Been Asking

Registrants are encouraged to contact the College with any practice questions and concerns. In the spirit of shared learning we will bring them forward in the CDHM News.

Question: Can any dental hygienist in Manitoba use topical anesthetic? Answer: No. The hygienist must have completed the additional education required and have been approved on the Oral Anesthetic Roster with the College. Topical anesthetic contains epinephrine which is a Schedule 1 drug with possible harmful side effects and therefore use is restricted by government for the protection of the public.

Question: If I renew my CPR in February one year and September the next year (19 months in between) it's still within the respective registration year. Is this ok? Answer: No. Evidence shows that unused knowledge and skills depreciate significantly over time. Unless someone is using CPR skills on a regular basis, such as with an emergency services provider, they are often unable to respond effectively in an emergency. Again, based on evidence, the average time frame to maintain reasonable efficacy of skills and best serve public needs is 12 months.

Question: I've just graduated and started working in a dental office and the dentist was sick one day. Can I still provide care to patients even though the dentist isn't there? Answer: In this case this would be a decision made based on discussion between the dentist the dental hygienist. This understanding should be put into a written agreement and signed by both parties. For a review of 'Supervision' please see the CDHM website under Practice Resources and review the 'Supervision Guideline' and 'Know the Act to Know How to Act'.

Question: Can I provide dental hygiene care for my spouse in Manitoba? Answer: Yes. Keeping in mind a dental hygienist's practice will always reflect our competencies regarding professional conduct, and the Manitoba privacy act - the Personal Health Information Act (PHIA).


I would also like to thank the many volunteers who continue to serve on the CDHM and RHPA committees! As we have in the past, we will continue to move forward with the efforts of many.

Registrar's Message Arlynn Brodie, MHS, RDH

As your registrar, I believe it is important to update you on changes in the regulatory landscape. Often, these changes may affect you as a

practicing dental hygienist in Manitoba. As a regulatory College, it is necessary to be aware and responsive to trends in healthcare regulation.

"Change can be frightening, and the temptation is often to resist it. But change almost always provides opportunities-to learn new things, to rethink tried process and to improve the way we work." Klaus Schwab

There are many changes on the horizon that could change regulatory governance for health care providers, including dental hygiene, in Manitoba. At this time there are two items of particular interest. First, the 'Cayton Report', a publication commissioned by the British Columbia Minister of Health and secondly, the new Shared Health initiative which is transforming healthcare delivery in Manitoba.

Cayton Report

Mr. Cayton is past CEO of the Professional Standards Authority and is a leader in the field of professional regulation. Mr. Cayton conducted a thorough analysis of the current regulatory practices of the College of Dental Surgeons of British Columbia (CDSBC). The report identified required changes to the operations of their College. **Cayton strongly suggested the report was not only for the CDSBC, but for all regulatory colleges of health professions.** A few of his recommendations from the report are as follows:

- Accountability of a College is to the citizens of the province
- Colleges should operate with increased transparency
- Colleges should be using data and risk assessment to enable regulatory effectiveness
- Numbers of Board/Council members should decrease (11-12)
- The Board/Council should not be involved in complaints and discipline
- Increased public member representation on Boards/Council and committees is required

Shared Health

Healthcare delivery in Manitoba is being re-structured under the new Shared Health framework. As a dental hygienist, you may think this is not particularly noteworthy, but the re-structuring may create significant opportunities for dental hygienists to practice in alternative settings. The new system will be designed to 'provide accessible healthcare at the right time and place'. It will incorporate clinical and preventive services in an integrated interprofessional approach to healthcare for all Manitobans. **Continued on Page 7**

Other Important Changes

The Manitoba government has mandated all health professions in Manitoba will be required to transition from their existing legislation to one umbrella legislation, called the Regulated Health Professions Act. (RHPA) The CDHM, in collaboration with the MDHA, have created Working Groups to develop our application to the RHPA. The work is ongoing and will take a large number of man hours to complete. If you are interested in assisting the College in this endeavor, please contact the College office and speak to the registrar.

During the winter months we worked hard, transitioning our registration software to an upgraded version; this has allowed the uploading of your CCP documents and will provide a new look to registration renewal. We have also introduced teleconference and online sharing platforms to enable improved communication between Council, committees and staff.

Our CDHM website, another communication tool, has finally launched! We hope you find it navigable and a good resource.

In closing, congratulations to all our U of M grads, welcome to the College and the profession!

I hope your summer is full of sunshine, family and friends, and I look forward to seeing you at our AGM in October!

Greetings from the CDHM office as the new Deputy Registrar. I'm happy and excited to have the opportunity to work with the regulatory body for dental hygienists in Manitoba. I am proud to be a dental hygienist in Manitoba

alongside all of you as primary oral health care providers to the citizens of our province. To be referred to as a "professional" is a privilege and to be known for providing "excellence in oral health care" is an honor.

One of my first tasks is to focus on our Continuing Competency Program or CCP; a program that many other regulatory bodies look to as a model for the professional continuing competency program of the future. The quote above illustrates the idea of this ongoing educational strategy of learning by doing. I will be working with reviewers and registrants providing ongoing evaluations of our program to maximise professional growth for registrants. This year's inaugural electronic uploading of CCP documents to our online platform, Alinity, was a success. Reviewers have been tasked with providing feedback to every registrant this year in order to help calibrate the program's collective educational potential.

Soon the new Alinity program will allow registrants to upload their PAR and CCR documents at any time during the year rather than having to keep track of everything and upload all at once. Our goal is to simplify this process so registrants can focus on their learning opportunities. Remember: the over-arching purpose of the CCP is public safety. The Government of Manitoba has mandated that our College be able to provide proof that our professionals regularly update their knowledge. This is done by recognizing our deficiencies or knowledge-gaps and providing proof of how we use good evidence to improve our practice. This demonstrates <u>accountability</u> to our profession. Ours is a fast-changing profession with new products, procedures and health considerations continually emerging. The citizens of Manitoba trust RDH's to be knowledgeable and practice safely. Dental hygienists of Manitoba have embraced this challenge.

I look forward to working with the CDHM, Council, and registrants as we continue to look to the future of providing oral health care to all Manitobans and embracing challenges as opportunities for growth.

May 24th

Council chair, Karina Hiebert, provided a verbal update to her written report which included a description of the recent CDHM Student Award selection process.

Registrar, Arlynn Brodie, presented the 4th quarter financials and the proposed 2019/2020 budget and updated Council on the AGM planning process. Included in her report was information on the new CDHM bookkeeping software called Zero; implementation will begin in the new fiscal year. Arlynn also updated Council on activities of the nine external Boards/ committees she attends on behalf of CDHM. Council was informed there will be a call-out for a Board of Assessor. Arlynn's environmental scan highlighted the outcomes of the Cayton report and the impact his report will have on the future of health profession regulation.

Mark Jones, the CDHM accountant, spoke to Council about CDHM financials and appropriate management of reserve funds.

Michael Hepples, from Blueshift innovations did a brief training session on the basics of Microsoft 'Teams' and discussed how it would be a useful communication tool for Council

Council discussed fees for 2020 registration renewal and will be presenting the fees to the AGM in October

The Registrar highlighted her briefing note on Reserve Fund management. Council discussed allocating a percentage of the reserve funds into low-risk GIC's.

Council Chair and Vice- Chair, Carol Hiscock, discussed the proposed Governance Budget.

Arlynn Brodie and Lee Hurton, Executive Director of MDHA, provided Council with a 'Refresher' on the roles of regulator and the member services Association.
